We form the future simple with **Will + infinitive without "to"**

AFFIRMATIVE		
I	will	work
You	will	
He	will	
She	will	
It	will	
We	will	
You	will	
They	will	

Contractions:
Will = 'll

NEGATIVE		
I	will not	work
You	will not	
He	will not	
She	will not	
It	will not	
We	will not	
You	will not	
They	will not	

Contraction:
will not = won't

INTERROGATIVE		
Will	I	work ?
Will	you	
Will	he	
Will	she	
Will	it	
Will	we	
Will	you	
Will	they	



SHORT ANSWERS
Yes. I will
Yes. He/she/it will
Yes. You/we/they will
No. I won't
No. He/she/it won't
No. You/we/they won't

USE

We use **will**:

- To predict the future.

Tomorrow will be a sunny day.

In the future, machines will do many of the jobs that people do today.

We won't arrive home before midnight tonight.

When we predict the future, we often use **will** with the following verbs and expressions:

think	expect	believe	be sure	be afraid	hope
-------	--------	---------	---------	-----------	------

*I **think** it will rain tomorrow.*

*I **am sure** you will enjoy the film.*

- When we decide to do something at the moment of speaking.

The phone is ringing. I 'll answer it.

A: I'm going out shopping.

B: Are you?. I 'll come with you.
