# PURPOSE: to... & for...

We use **to + infinitive** to talk about a person's purpose (to say why someone does something).

I went to England **to** <u>learn</u> English.

He is going out to do some shopping.

She went to the Sports Centre to play basketball.

We use **for + noun** to talk about a person's purpose (to say why someone does something).

I'm going out for a walk.

We went to a restaurant for lunch.

#### **COMPARE:**

TO + Infinitive	FOR + Noun
We went to a restaurant <u>to</u> have lunch	We went to a restaurant <b>for</b> lunch
I must go to the supermarket <u>to</u> buy food	I must go to the supermarket <b>for</b> food

#### **REMEMBER!**

We do not use for + infinitive to say why someone does something:

I went to England **for** <u>learn</u> English > I went to England <u>to</u> <u>learn</u> English
We went to a restaurant <u>for</u> <u>eat</u> dinner > We went to a restaurant <u>to</u> eat <u>dinner</u>

We use **for + V-ing** to talk about the purpose or function of a thing.

A thermometer is a thing we use **for** <u>measuring</u> temperature. We use a knife **for** <u>cutting</u> bread.
