

WHICH OR WHAT?

We ask **which?** when there is a limited choice.

We ask **what?** when there is a wide choice.



Which iPod do you prefer, black or white?

What is your favourite football team?

Sometimes both are possible:

Which/What day next week can you come and see me?

Before **of** and **one**, we can use **which** but not **what**:

Which of the countries in Europe have you visited?

Look at those stars. *Which one* is the nearest?

When there is no noun, we use **who** for people, not **which**:

Which boxer won?

Who won?
